



IGR Service Checklist

- IGR must be consumed at least every other day, all season long.
- Consumption of IGR product must start before the horn fly control season starts.
- Proper consumption is a very important part of the IGR Program. When starting an IGR Program, make sure cattle aren't starved for mineral.
- Ensure cattle consume recommended amount of IGR product. Refer to specific product label for recommended intake.
- Adequate feeder space is needed — usually 15 to 20 cattle per feeder. Check manufacturer's stocking rate from mineral feeder being used.
- Location of the feeder must be adjusted to get proper consumption. If consumption is low, move the feeders closer to water or loafing areas. More feeders may be needed. If consumption is too high, move feeders further away from water or loafing area.
- No fly control method can guarantee 100% control of horn flies. IGR is intended to control horn flies, not eradicate the population. Horn fly control is considered excellent at 90%. More realistically, you can expect IGR to control 80-85% of horn flies.
